- As the renewed SRP must be consistent and supportive of the renewed Academic Plan, drafts of the renewed SRP are not anticipated until the Academic Plan is finalized or near finalization in the first quarter of 2012.

- We will continue to consult widely with the Saint Mary's Community right up until the SRP is finalized for consideration by Senate.
- It is intended to have the SRP ready for consideration by Senate for its May 2012 meeting.
