How do I obtain a library card?

Thanks to the Libraries Nova Scotia initiative (BARA), any Nova Scotian resident, 19 years or older, may borrow in person from most libraries in the province, including university libraries. All you need to do is register at the library you wish to use and, in this case, a Novanet card will be issued. The applicant must provide identification that links their name with a recognizable photo, and their photo with a Nova Scotian address. A Nova Scotia Driver's License or a Nova Scotia Identity Card could be one such ID card; a combination of source documents, such as a picture ID card and a telephone or power bill with an address, serves this purpose as well. You must have a S# in order to access electronic books, journals, and file-shares from off-campus, and to gain access to the on-campus computers.
